As a part of the Physics Department, the Physics Learning Center (PLC) seeks to provide students in our large-lecture classes a place to improve their understanding of difficult material. In particular, the large-lecture setting does not address everyone's learning style and students can find themselves working very hard without developing the conceptual understanding so critical to problem solving. We are not a drop-in tutoring center as that service is already available in consultation hours, through GUTS, and through the physics club. What we offer is structured sessions that meet twice each week at times that fit your schedule, extra exam review sessions, a room where you can study with friends, and a supportive environment. Our sessions are run by trained Peer/Mentor Tutors (PMTs) who are physics undergraduates and are often just a year or two out of the same classes you are in. They do not just lecture but lead you through practice problems keyed to the content in physics 207. They will know what you see in lecture and HW.
